






We look forward to welcoming you to our 13 mile race, from Beaumaris to Caernarfon beneath the two famous bridges which span the Menai Strait

Entries are open for fixed seat or sliding seat boats. Boats must be sea going class and can be one, two, four or six seated. Swapping seat positions is permitted between Cox and Rower BUT not between the Menai suspension and the Britannia bridges.

Should weather conditions dictate then an alternative point to point race may be run.




Starting: Royal Anglesey Yacht Club, Beaumaris – 6 Green Edge, Beaumaris LL58 8BY

Provisional Timetable of events

All trailer drivers who are rowing the race will need to depart Beaumaris with their trailer by 9.30am at the latest. They need to drop of their trailer and vehicle at the Aberforeshore carpark in Caernarfon by 10.00am, to ensure they can be back in Beaumaris and launching by 11.00am

Equipment Required

- 8m tow rope securely attached to the boat
- personal floatation aids (life jacket or buoyancy aid) for each crew member
- a waterproofed means of communicating with others ideally a waterproof VHF radio
- two bailers tied to the boat

WSR Rules

WSR Race Categories and Rules apply, as laid out on their website **www.searowing.wales/ race-categories/**, here's a reminder of key relevant points:

Before racing

- All boats must register
- All boats must be seaworthy to race
- All crew members must have paid their WSR personal levy & affiliation fee and be registered with the WSR membership secretary NOTE: or British Rowing, ICRF, SCRA or equivalent
- All crews must send a representative to the coxes' briefing. All local rules explained in this meeting must be abided by

Race starts

- Crews should form a line between the two start markers. Crews may start behind the line but not in front of it. Penalties will be applied to crews jumping the start line (see organising events)
- Yoles will start at one end of the start line
- When crews are resembling a line, the race organisers will signal a 'ready' alert (identified in coxes' briefing) and the raising of the race flag. Racing may start at any point after this
- The start of the race will be signalled by the dropping of the race flag and the sounding of a hooter, and also by VHF radio
- All coxes must wear lifejackets.
- All junior crew members must wear lifejackets. U18s must wear a lifejacket even when rowing with a senior crew.

During the race

- Green flag Racing under way. Course as advertised.
- Yellow flag Racing under way. Course altered. Follow lead boat against advertised course
- Red flag Race cancelled. Follow lead boat to shore. Do not hinder progress of other boats
- We will use VHF channel 37 or 'M'

Booking & Registration

The race fee is £15 per person (£75 per longboat, £30 per double scull etc) which includes the meal after the race. Entries are limited, so please ensure you complete the entry form and return to RWYC by the deadline.

Payments by cash on the day at registration, or by bank transfer in advance. Details will be supplied by email.
